Government attention to hospice contractual relationships has evolved beyond surveys of the Medicare Conditions of Participation (CoPs). This means hospices need to understand how contracts impact their professional management responsibilities, the hospice conditions of payment, and the anti-kickback statute. It was the report that should have been heard round the hospice world: On May 1, 2014, CMS released a report it commissioned from Abt Associates entitled "Medicare Hospice Payment Reform: Analyses to Support Payment Reform." This watershed report used objective data to raise critical questions not only about how hospices are paid, but also about the quality of care they provide and whether they achieve cost savings. In this increasingly data-driven world, hospices need to evaluate their business based on identified government target areas and outliers. During this session, the presenters will share their breadth of knowledge to help hospices understand and anticipate how the data they report may be analyzed and used by the government to audit them.
